In 2017, I was diagnosed with pulmonary fibrosis. I started workup at UT Southwestern, and while that was happening, I was waiting to be put on list for a lung transplant. I was denied six different times for transplant until finally Houston Methodist accepted me. The doctors told me every case is custom to each individual, so getting a spot was very difficult, but I finally got my miracle! I received my new gift of life on April 7th, 2022.

What is the first thing you wanted to do after receiving your transplant?

I just wanted to get out of the hospital. Being in there for eight months was very tiring and getting to go home was something I loved. I also wanted to get in good shape. Building my immune system and getting my body back to normal was a goal of mine.
