Transplant Journey: I was born with 4 fully functioning kidneys, by the time I was 11 I was down to 1 kidney. It wasn't until my 30s they started giving me trouble. Last November 2022, I was admitted to the hospital and told to consider dialysis. On May 2nd I had the peritoneal dialysis put in. Without having to ask, both of my sisters volunteered to be tested to be a donor. My sister Kelli was a match! That same month we were approved for surgery and the date was set for July 14th. While we were living in 2 different states, I was in such awe of my sister. She told our family it was her dream since us being little girls to give me a kidney. Kelli flew in the day before surgery from Ohio and here we are now. It has been tough, a couple of setbacks with dehydration and infection but I feel so much better today and look forward to all tomorrow. Thank you, sister!
