We drove to Dallas for evaluations, but unfortunately I was denied. I refused to give up. My niece, who is one of my caregivers began to call around when we came across St. Lukes Hospital in Houston. We prayed about it and were able to be scheduled for a virtual consultation, After that appointment everything began falling into place.

On the 27th of March I was accepted onto the transplant waitlist and on May 3rd, we received THE call; a lung was ready for me. We loaded up the car and headed to Houston. After the surgery, my healing process could not have gone better. I could not be more thankful for the amazing team of medical professionals and their level of care for me.
