**Transplant Journey:** It all started in August 2015 when I was put on Ofev medicine and diagnosed with IPF. I was good for about five years until I was diagnosed with COVID in January 2021. The following year, in July 2022, I developed COVID for the second time and was put on oxygen full-time. In November 2022, I developed the flu, and everything continued to go downhill from there. The pomologist said they could not do anything else and recommended a lung transplant. The first hospital wasn't doing transplants, so they referred me to Houston Methodist in Houston. In February 2023 I began testing to see if I was a candidate. On the last test, they found 2 heart blockages and I felt defeated. That following Monday, I had stents put in for the blockages. We moved into Nora's in June 2023 while waiting for the call. On August 12, 2023, I got the call that they found a match while at the aquarium. On August 13 I received my second chance at life. Afterward, I was on a feeding tube for 3 months but am not doing well, now I'm eating everything in sight.

What is the first thing you want to do when you go home?

The first thing we are going to do when we get home is have a BBQ/Crawfish boil and enjoy our family at Easter time to celebrate.

## What do you enjoy most about Nora's Home?

I enjoy meeting new people and making new friends who are just like me. I've learned so much from all the people here.

## What would you say to someone who is considering becoming an organ donor?

Do it! It is a no brainer to give someone another chance if you can. If it wasn't for my donor, I would not have received my chance.
