# **Transplant Journey:**

In March of 2024, I was about to leave my house when I started having trouble breathing. My fiancé, quick to act, called 911 and I was taken to the hospital. Upon arrival, we were informed that my right lung had collapsed and I would need a transplant as soon as possible. Unfortunately, they paused lung transplantation in Louisiana since COVID-19 so I stayed in the hospital for about a month as my hope rested in my case being accepted by another transplant center. My doctor received a phone call from a surgeon in Houston, Texas who by the grace of God accepted my case. I was then transferred from Baton Rouge to Houston by ambulance and stayed in the hospital for two long months waiting for the call.

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On May 23, 2024 after enduring uncertainty and anticipation I received my double lung transplant. It took the medical team 13.5 hours and after surgery I was told my lungs looked like chewing gum. They didn't know how I managed to live in the condition I was in. After a month of recovering in the hospital I found my home away from home at Nora's Home.

### What is the first thing you want to do when you go home?

I want to see my 4 children. My children are ages 24, 22, 17, and 16 years old. Although I Facetime them all the time it will be different to be able to hug them.

#### What do you enjoy most about Nora's Home?

I love how peaceful it is here. Every time I come back to Houston for my monthly visits, I am going to call here first and try to make a reservation. It really feels like a home away from home.

# What has been your favorite space at Nora's Home?

The dining room. I love all the events that take place in this space. I was drawn to the chair closest to the kitchen when I first came to Nora's Home, and I've sat at the same spot ever since when enjoying a meal.
